





### **Do Masons Practice Discrimination?**

The following is from "The Bulletin" issued by Arizona Masonry, and is a talk by Dean Tulston, who was the Grand Master at the time.

"Some months ago I was interviewed by a local Radio station and was asked questions concerning the Masonic Fraternity. At one point, the question was asked 'Do Masons practice discrimination in their membership policies?'

I replied as follows: "We certainly do. Since our membership is limited to Men, I guess it could be said that we discriminate against Women. In most States, a petitioner must be 21 years of age, so it could be said that we discriminate against teenagers; we demand a belief in a Supreme Being so we surely discriminate against the Atheist; we demand that a man be of good character and reputation, and we carefully investigate each applicant to be sure he meets those standards, so we do discriminate against the criminal, the immoral man, the bum. I am glad to be a part of this type of discrimination. But we have no law or regulation that permits us to discriminate against any man because of religion or creed, race or color, so long as he meets the high standards we demand"

Trust services and its importance to us all, will be presented by Marc Prian, a Trust Officer for Trusco Bank, on April 11, 2002.


We'll recap our activities during the year on May 23, 2002. Be with us then for an exchange of spirited commentaries.

# Howard B Clarkson, 32\* MSA To Be Feted

Brother Howard B Clarkson received the prestigious Meritorious Service Award at the 132nd Annual Convocation of the Council of Deliberation held at the Masonic Home Campus in Utica, New York.

Howard was born on November 15, 1924, in Sharon CT, and graduated from Pawling High School, Troy, and from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute as a Civil Engineer, in 1951.

He is married to the former Janet Day since 1947. They have one daughter, Barbara, and two grandchildren.

Brother Clarkson was employed by the Delaware and Hudson Railroad, and in 1961 he was appointed Deputy Director of the Office of Transportation in NY State, and later served as Director of the Highway, Aviation, and Ports Division of the NY State Department of Transportation.

Howard served in the US Navy during World War II, including participation in the D-Day landings in Normandy, June 6, 1944.

Brother Clarkson was raised a Master Mason in Phoenix Lodge No 58, Lansingburg NY on April 20, 1956, initiated into the Valleys of Albany and Troy Scottish Rite in 1993, serving as Most Wise Master of the Troy Delta Chapter of Rose Croix. He is also a member of the Oriental Temple A.A.O.N.M.S.
