

Order of Knights of the Double Eagle

Knights of the Double Eagle Program a Winner Robert H. Fickies, 32°, MSA

The Knight of the Double Eagle Service Award Program was established in the Valley of Albany in 2008, as a means of recognizing members who actively participate in Valley programs and Scottish Rite sponsored events. Our program was adapted from similar programs active in a number of valleys in the Southern Masonic Jurisdiction. The Valley of Albany is the first valley in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction authorized to run the program. Our members greeted the program with enthusiasm. Currently, there are more than 60 brothers who are participating in the program.

At the Valley's regular (joint) meeting on Thursday, February 18th, twelve brothers will be knighted, and will receive their Double Eagle jewel. These brothers will be the first Knights of the Double Eagle in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.

All members of the Valley of Albany are eligible to become Knights of the Double Eagle by actively participating in the business, events and activities conducted or sponsored by the Valley. Points are awarded for participation, and upon receiving 500 points, a member is made a Knight of the Double Eagle, and presented with the jewel signifying his knighthood.

Points are assigned to a brother for participation in valley meetings, events, and service in the officers' line. While only 500 points are needed for knighthood, additional points and recognition can be earned for up to 20,000 points.

More information on the program, and how points are awarded can be found on the valley's web site. The information, and a current list of members and points assigned are also posted in the Valley's conference room on the 4th floor of the Albany Masonic Hall.

Their flexibility and enthusiasm make the Knights of Saint Andrew one of the Valley's most active and desirable organizations. It is an excellent way to nurture and develop future leaders as they learn their organizational and leadership skills, explore the inner structures of their Scottish Rite Centers, and thus gain a deeper admiration for our Order and Brethren who work in Freemasonry as a whole."
