

A Message from your Junior Warden

My Road to the Rite

Well, it's been a little over a year now since I have been raised out of the dark garden as a Master Mason, like millions before me. Although that time has been short, it's been a journey filled with lessons that serve to remind me to live according to the Plumb, on the Level, and by the Square. I will admit it has not been a road without scenic overlooks that delayed and rough patches that jostled. So I offer just a few of the interesting tidbits I picked up along the way.

Being raised in Noah Lodge #754, I wanted to know why that name was chosen. Whilst searching, I learned that at one time in Masonry, there were two versions of the ritual, one with Hiram and another with Noah as central figures. Along those lines, many, many versions of where Masonry's roots began lie and I'm still searching for the sources on the Lodge in the city of York that was the Masonic authority in England in the decades prior to the formation of the London Lodge.

I was told that the Scottish Rite didn't begin in Scotland but in France, but now through reading, it seems that it just may have gotten its start in Scotland and only came to France after the House of Hanover became the rulers of England. This change led several failed invasions by the Stuart Loyalists or "Jacobites" as they were called that launched from Scotland. The Jacobites were forced to flee and live in France in exile. It is here that our Rite is rumored to have got its start. The political maneuverings of the exiles to return the House of Stuart to the throne are alleged to be embedded in the degree system that our degrees come from. In some circles, that connection has led to our moniker to be Stuart Masons, in recognition of those alluded ties between our Fraternity and the Jacobites.

These are just some of the byways, bumps, and scenic overlooks that have led me to becoming an The Rite Lite

active Scottish Rite member. With so much to see, learn and share, and the opportunity for fellowship with good Brethren, choosing Ancient American Scottish Rite was a no-brainer. I will be directing some degrees over the next year and would welcome Brothers to take a role, lend a hand, or provide guidance as we walk to this road together.

Secretary's Note

Sublime Princes, Brothers:

Our Supreme Council and our Council of Deliberation have emphasized the premium they place on membership development by launching three new programs. The first is the Bookend Degrees. Through this program, a Brother becomes a 32nd Degree Mason when he has conferred upon him the 4th and 32nd degrees plus a minimum of three additional degrees that reflect the core values of the Rite. These are selected by the Valley. The core values are: reverence for God, justice, toleration, devotion to country, service to humanity, and integrity. The beauty of this program is that it allows the Valleys to try new degrees that are not traditionally performed at Reunions. This will be good for membership development and membership retention. After all, every one of us should strive to fill our Passports.

The second innovation involves celebration of our 200th Anniversary from August 5, 2012 through December 31, 2013. There will not be one single event or Anniversary Class but a series of events driven by each individual Valley. The Valley of Albany is the oldest Scottish Rite Valley in North America. Take pride in this distinction and let your officers know if you are interested in helping to celebrate this significant milestone of 200 Years of Brotherhood. All ideas for Valley events will be gratefully received and considered.

Finally, our Supreme Council has challenged each Valley to increase membership by 6% over the next two years. As an incentive to achieve this modest goal, the top first line signers, top Valley Secretaries, and top Valley Membership Development Chairmen are eligible for prizes. Reach out to your Brothers and invite them to receive more Light in Masonry by membership in Scottish Rite Masonry. Your enthusiasm will be contagious. All new members who become 32nd degree Masons between January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2013 will receive a beautiful pocket jewel created to commemorate the 200th Anniversary. Other members can purchase the

medal from Supreme Council for \$25.00 each. (See a black/white replica on page 2.)

I hope you feel the excitement. Scottish Rite Masonry in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction is living up to its distinction of being the premiere concordant Masonic body by encouraging all of us to strive to be a fraternity that fulfills our Masonic obligation to care for our members.
